Progress and Attainment Report: September 2019

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Hawkley Hall High School Provisional GCSE Results 2019

Introduction

This year saw the newly reformed GCSEs being examined under the new grading system of 9 – 1 for the second time in all the GCSEs offered at Hawkley Hall High School, together with the various vocational qualifications suitable for identified groups of students that we offer.

The new Key stage 4 performance measures are as follows...

- **Attainment 8:** the actual average attainment score a student achieves in a suite of 8 qualifications – English, mathematics, 3 EBacc subjects and 3 other GCSEs/approved qualifications.
- **Progress 8:** the difference between the average actual attainment of all our students and the estimated average attainment of all students nationally for all prior abilities. This year schools will see their adjusted and unadjusted scores.
- **% 5+ English and maths:** the % of students achieving a grade 9 -5 (a strong pass) in English Language or Literature and mathematics
- **EBacc Average Point Score (APS) :** this is calculated by allocating points to a student's best grades in EBacc subjects as follows
 1. Best grade in English
 2. Grade for maths
 3. Best two grades in science
 4. Better grade in either geography or history
 5. Best grade in a language

If a student does not fill an area, they will be awarded zero for that element. The scores are then totalled up and divided by 6. The school's average is the average of its cohort.

The DfE will calculate the provisional Progress 8 score this term when the new national estimated attainment scores have been calculated for each different starting point.

Key Stage 2 Average Points Score

The average points score on entry was 29.9 compared to the national average of 28.9

This equates to a Key Stage 2 English and mathematics fine level of 4.99

The girls' Key Stage 2 English/maths fine points score was 4.94 compared to the boys' English/maths fine points score of 5.03

This was the first year group nationally to have their average KS2 points score based on reading and mathematics rather than reading, writing and mathematics.

2019 Accountability Measures

Attainment 8 Score: 47.5

The average grade achieved by Hawkley Hall High School is categorised as **4.75**. This is equivalent to a high grade 4 (an increase of 3 points from 2018 which equates to 0.3 of a grade improvement for all students)

Progress 8 Score:

Basics: 67% (Grades 9 - 4) 42% (Grades 9 - 5)

67% of students achieved Grade 4 or above (a standard pass) in both an English GCSE qualification and mathematics GCSE (an increase of 3% from 2018).

42% of students achieved Grade 5 or above (a strong pass) in both an English GCSE qualification and mathematics GCSE (an increase of 7% from 2018).

EBacc APS 3.76

This figure is for all students in the cohort (an increase of 0.28 from 2018). For the 16 students that fulfil all the criteria the figure is 5.76 for a standard pass and 4.71 for a strong pass.

The overall percentage for English 9 – 4 grades and 9 - 5 grades is based on the students' best qualification in English Language or Literature.

Overall, 82.3% of students achieved grade 4+ for English and 70.3% achieved grade 5+ (compared to 81.9% and 58.1% respectively in 2018)

61.3% of students gained a standard pass in two sciences compared to 59.6% in 2018

60.9% of students achieved 5+ standard passes including English and maths (compared to 56.9% in 2018)

14.1% of students achieved 5 or more grades of 9-7 compared to 11.9% in 2018 with an amazing 42 grade 9s being achieved by students in all subjects.

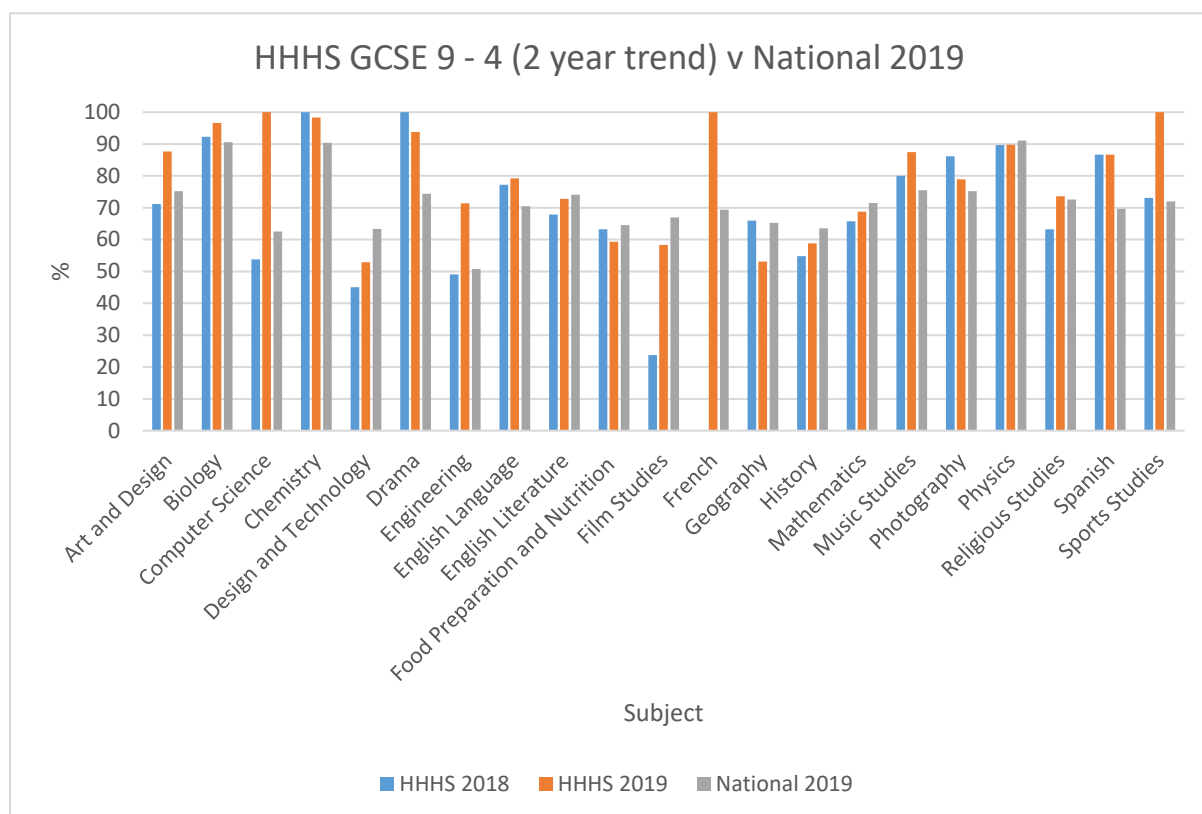
The national figures are provisional figures that were released on GCSE results day 22nd August 2019 based on candidates entered from England only.

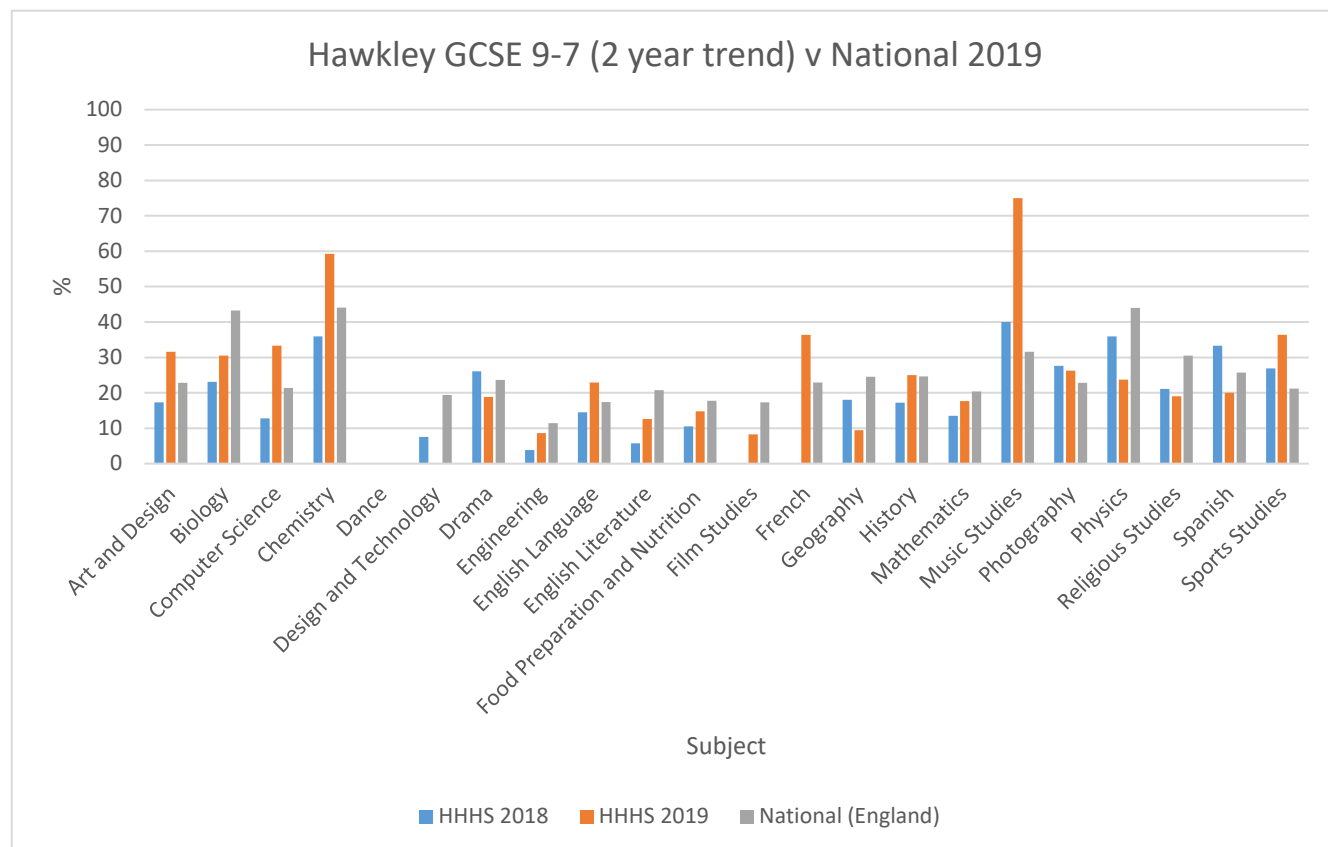

Analysis of Attainment

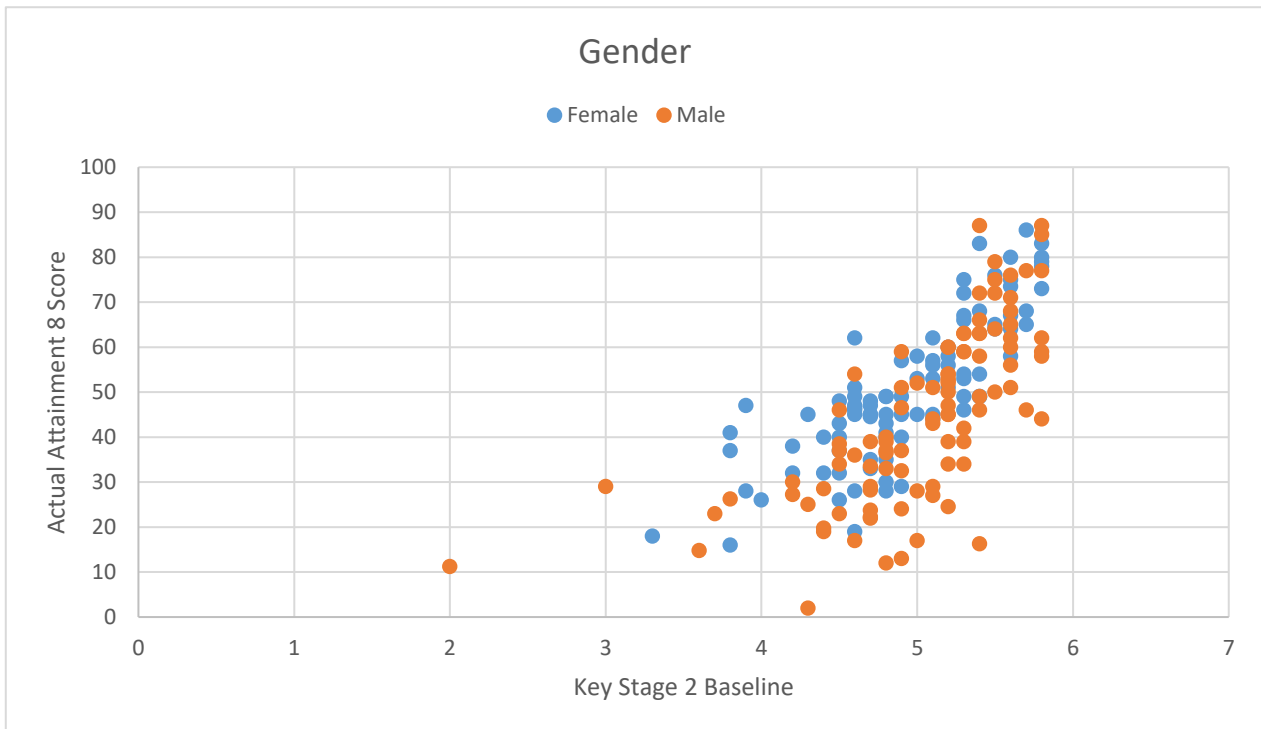
Overall Average Attainment 8 - All students: 47.5

52% of the cohort were boys and 48% were girls.

2018 Boys: **40.7 (4-)** Girls: **47.6 (4+)**

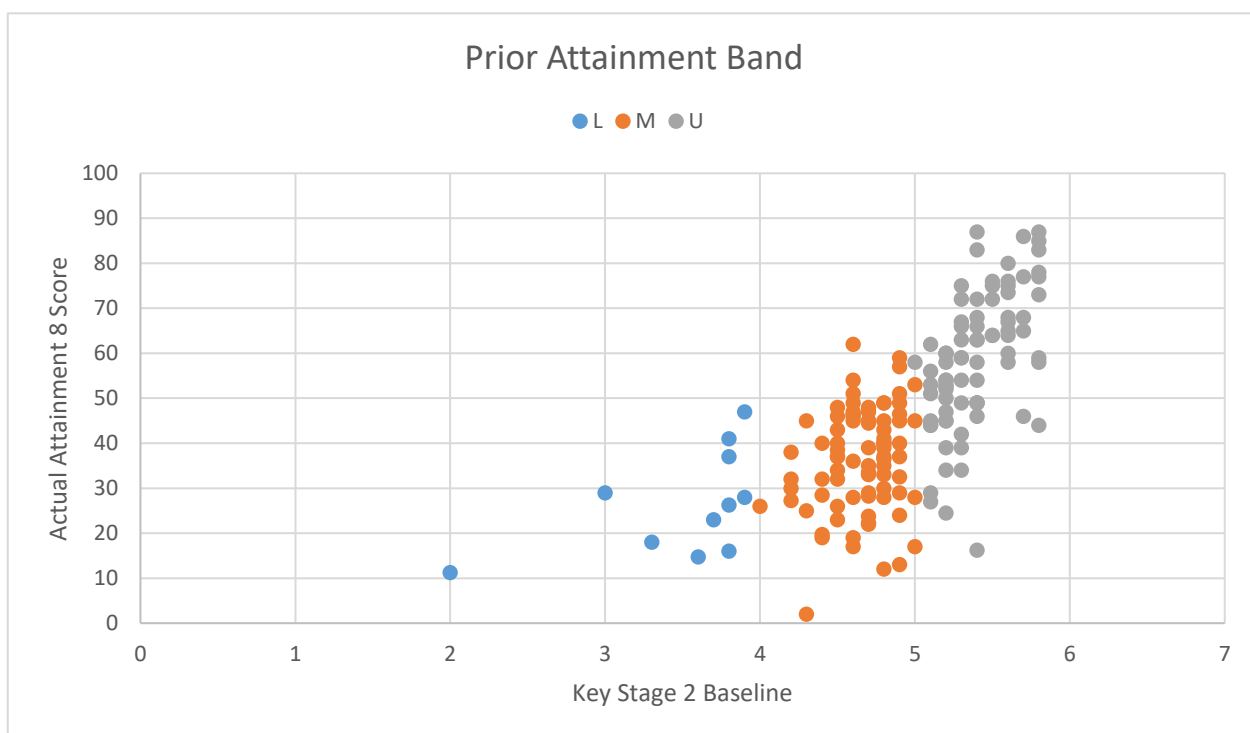


Prior Attainment

6% of the cohort were in the lower band, 42% in the middle band and 52% in the upper band.

2018 Low: **17.7 (1+/2-)** Middle: **38.5 (3+/4-)** Upper: **56.8 (5+)**

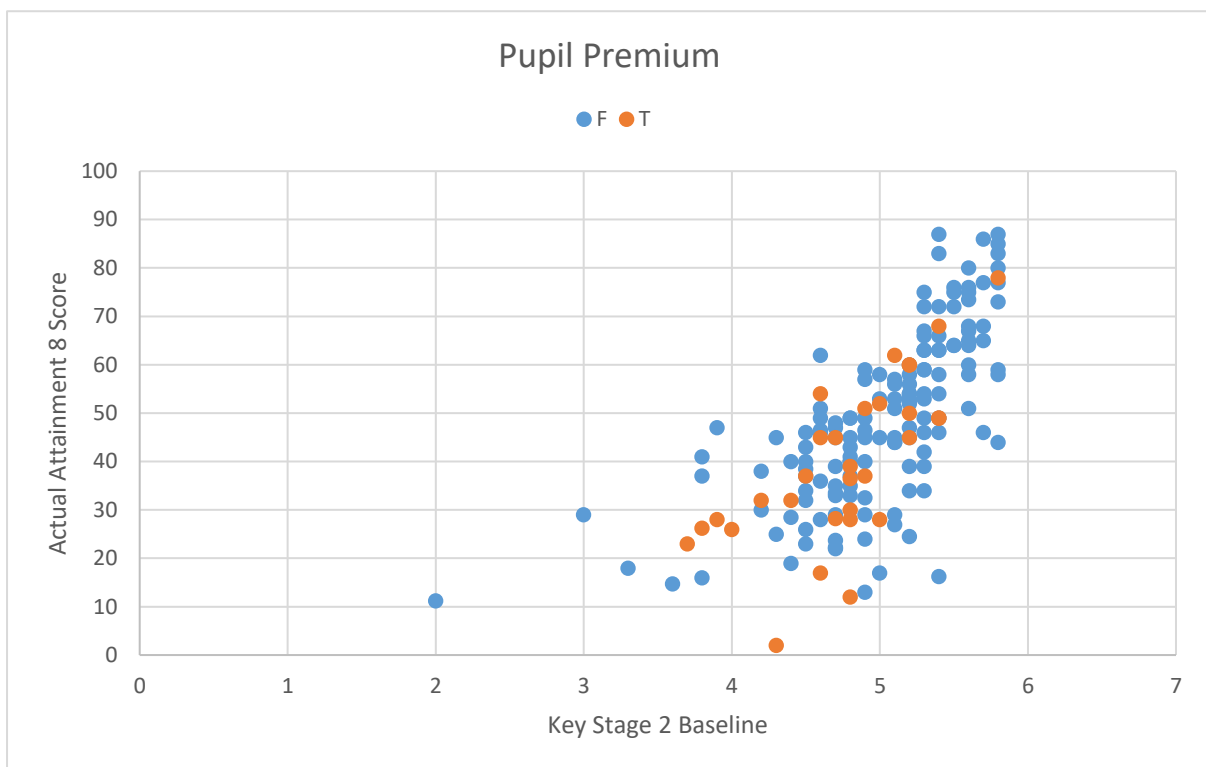


Disadvantaged

Progress 8

All students, based on their KS2 prior attainment have estimated attainment scores regardless of their gender and pupil premium/SEND status. If a student achieves their estimated attainment score then their Progress 8 contribution would be 0.

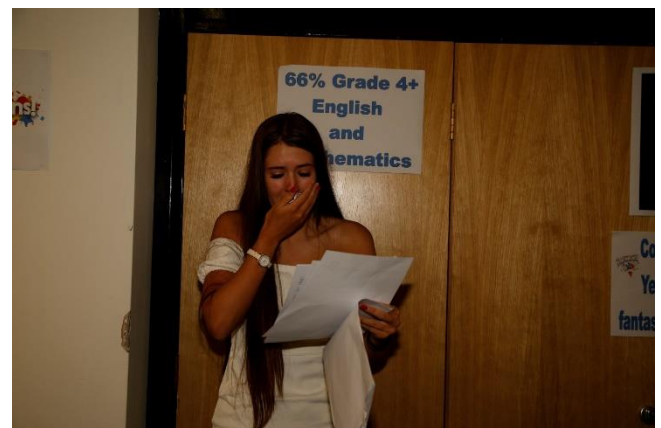
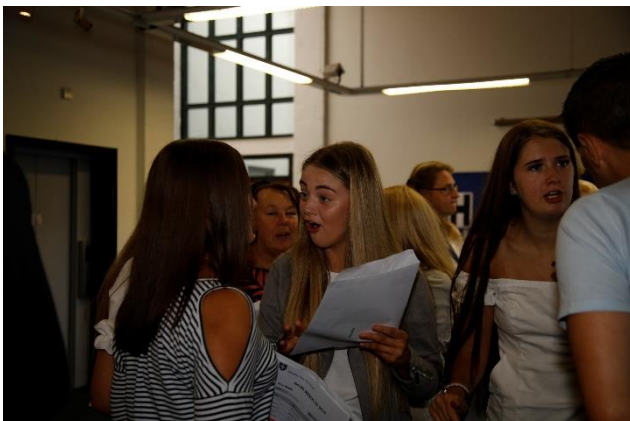
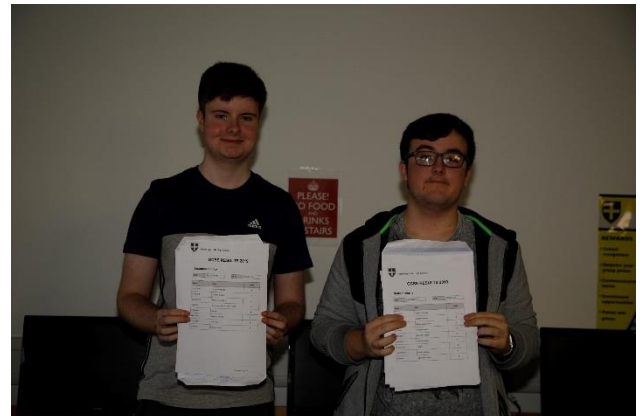
